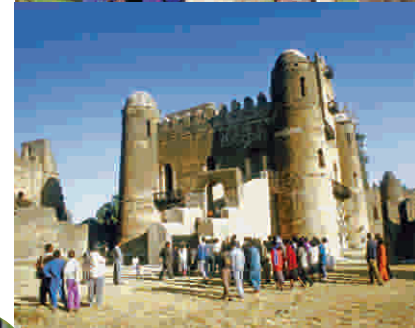

The best time to visit is October, November, December, Mid Feb, March, April & May. In Aksum, elaborate pre-Christian tombs underlie ancient obelisks; in Lalibela a medieval maze of rock-hewn churches lies frozen in stone. The wealth of history continues in Gondar, where grand 17th-century castles overlook the celebrated source of the Blue Nile, Lake Tana. The lake's waters host centuries-old island monasteries and countless religious artifacts. Timkat Festival: The Feast of Epiphany - 19 January. Music food and processions mark the festival dating back over 1000 years. The best places to enjoy the festival are Gondar, Lalibela and Addis Ababa.

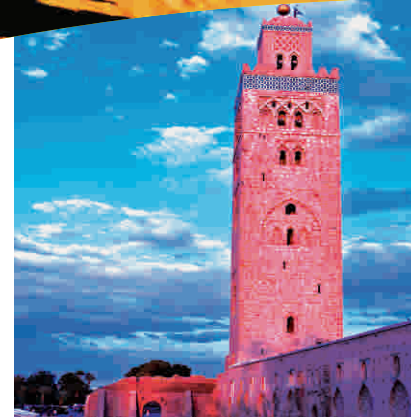

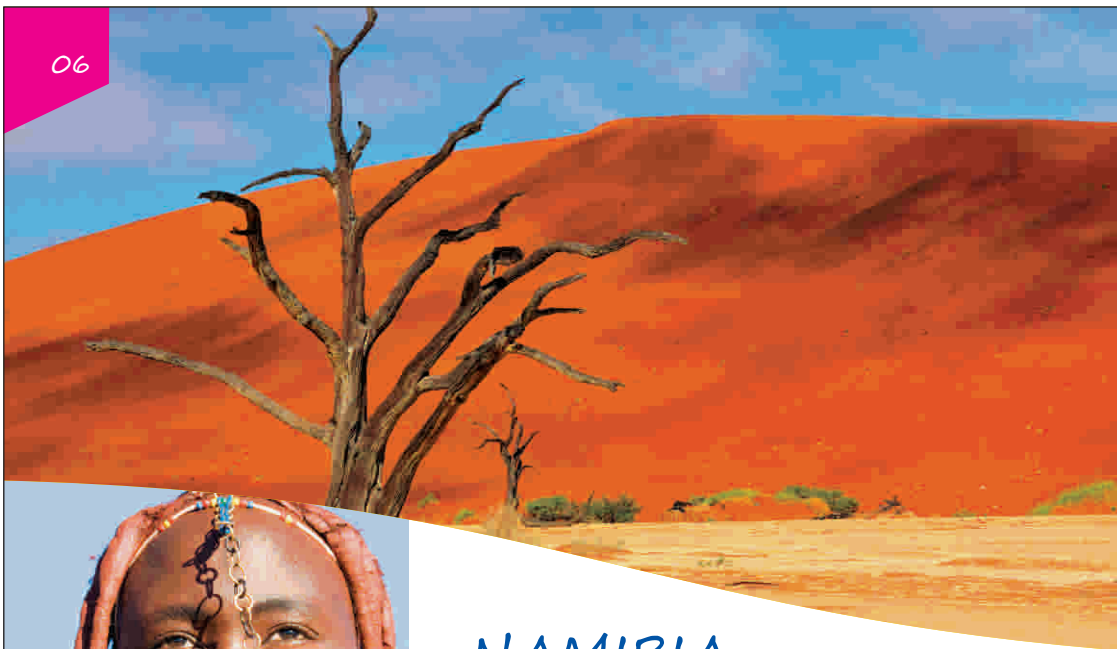

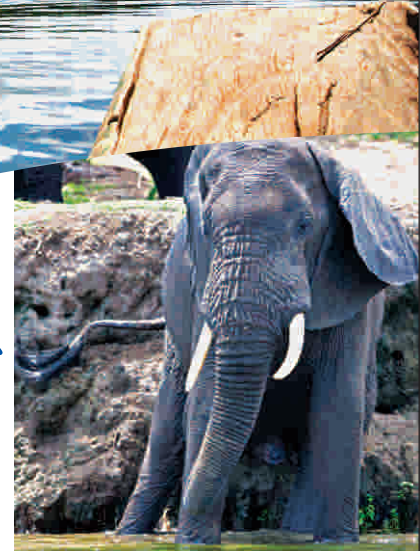

Namibia is all year destination. April & May are lovely months in Namibia. Increasingly dry, with a real freshness in the air, and much greenery in the landscape; From June to August Namibia cools down and dries out more; nights can become cold, dropping below freezing in some desert areas. By September and October it warms up again; game-viewing in most areas is at its best. Known as the "Gem of Africa", is a unique place for eco-tourists. From Himbas one of the most authentic tribes in Africa to the one of the world's biggest deserts and national parks to tropical forests and savannas with one of Africa's most concentration of wild animals.

Uganda is known as Green pearl of Africa. The best time to visit Uganda for gorilla trekking is during: January and February and from June to September. Game viewing in Uganda's savannah parks is best at the end of the dry seasons - February, March and September, October & November- when wildlife is concentrated around water sources. Rwanda's relatively high altitude provides it with a remarkably pleasant tropical highland climate, albeit also with plenty of rain. Rwanda's long rainy season lasts from about March to May, when the rain is heavy and persistent. Then from June to mid-September is the long dry season; this is generally the best time to visit. The Museum of genocide in Kigali is a must visit.
