Summer (mid-June to September) is the ideal time for hiking and camping. In September you can still swim comfortably in the Adriatic. Autumn is beautiful, particularly in the mountains of Gorenjska and Stajerska. Winter (December to March) is for skiers. Slovenia offers pristine landscape in the middle of Europe, with soaring vistas of Alpine peaks, hills and dales straight out of a 19th-century landscape painting, and sparkling lakes and rivers that appear to be underlit by emeralds. Most people visit Croatia between April and September. May and June are great months for all outdoor activities (except skiing). July and August are the most expensive months to visit Croatia. Croatia's rare blend of glamour and old-fashioned authenticity make this Europe's 'it' destination, where beaches and sunshine vie for attention with cultural treasures, ancient architecture and time-tested folk traditions.
