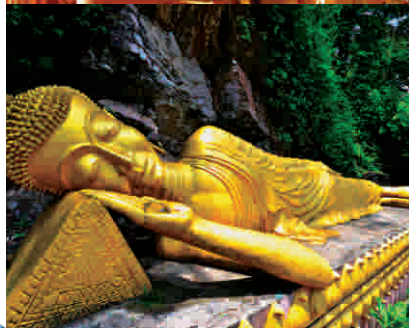

The best time to visit most of Thailand is between November and February. This period is also Thailand's main season for festivals, like Loi Krathong. In Bangkok visit, Temple of the Emerald Buddha, Housed in a fantastically decorated böht (chapel) and guarded by pairs of yaksha (mythical giants). Visit Chiang Mai -piercing the foothills of northern Thailand, and smuggling up to Doi Suthep. It contains hundreds of sacred temples. Ascend to the realm of the gods, Angkor Wat. Descend into the hell of the Khmer Rouge at Tuol Sleng. The yet charismatic capital of Phnom Penh is a hub of political intrigue, economic vitality and intellectual debate. Colour is the first of Luang Prabang's virtues to greet travellers. Encircled by mountains, and set 700m above sea level at the confluence of the Nam Khan (Khan River) and the Mekong River, It is now Laos' foremost tourist showpiece.
